

PRE-REQUISITES

- Registered in a Surrey public school and have achieved Ministry of Education graduation requirements when the program starts
- Must be willing to transition to fulltime work after completing the four week training
- Good attendance and punctuality
- Physical ability to do the work, able to work outside and capable of lifting 22 kg / 50 lbs

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Have a discussion with your Career Facilitator, counsellor and parent/guardian to ensure the program meets your goals
- Obtain a district partnership application package from your Career Centre
- Arrange for a site visit through your Career Facilitator
- Submit a completed application package with all supporting documents to your Career Facilitator before the specified due date
- If short-listed, attend an interview with the District Career Coordinator

SELECTION PROCESS

- Students who submit completed applications will have a preliminary interview with their school Career Facilitator
- Applications are forwarded to the district office for review
- Only short-listed candidates will be interviewed for a potential seat in the program
- Students must be able to meet the physical demands of the program
- Students must meet all criteria, be self-motivated, independent learners and capable of success in the program

Are you interested in becoming a Construction Craft Worker (CCW)?

JOB DESCRIPTION

Construction Craft Workers (Labourers) work mostly on construction sites in residential, institutional, commercial and industrial settings, including pipelines, utilities, hydroelectric dams, roadways, bridges, tunnels, shipyards, mining and railways. Their tasks include site preparation and cleanup, setting up and removing access equipment, and assisting on concrete, masonry, steel, wood and pre-cast erection projects. They handle materials and equipment and perform demolition, excavation and compaction activities. They may also perform site safety and security checks.



CONNECT TO POST SECONDARY OR EMPLOYMENT

The school district and training provider will make every effort to connect students to employment upon completion of the program.

Students can also continue to complete their red seal trade certification.

COURSE CREDITS

- TRITA 2A

PROGRAM LENGTH

- 4 weeks
- Starts last week of June

COSTS (Paid by the Student)

SKILLEDTRADESBC YOUTH WORK IN TRADES PROGRAM

Students may have the opportunity to receive up to 16 additional high school credits for paid apprentice work. Continued paid work and schooling may earn you Red Seal certification.

YOUTH WORK IN TRADES SCHOLARSHIP

Students may have the opportunity to apply for a Ministry of Education / SkilledTradesBC scholarship of \$1,000.00. This scholarship program begins after July 1, 2024.
